Anuragini Shreeya is Assistant Professor (ad-hoc) in the Department of Sociology. Her research so far has broadly been in the areas of sociology of organisations, organisational socialisation and training, bureaucracy, and the study of the ‘self’ within organisations. Currently, she is in the process of completing her PhD thesis, which through an ethnographic study, seeks to examine the process of bureaucratic training in India. Prior to this, she has also received her MPhil degree, which was based on Erving Goffman’s concept of Total Institutions which sought to understand three crucial aspects of confinement in total institutions– Surveillance, Mortification, and Resistance – and the way these aspects interact with the ‘self’ of those who are confined.

She has been a student of sociology at LSR, Delhi School of Economics, and Jawaharlal Nehru University, and has been a university rank holder throughout. Along with this, she has also been a UGC Junior Research Fellow (JRF) and Senior Research Fellow (SRF). She has presented her research at conferences and published in prestigious journals. At JMC, she is staff adviser to the National Service Scheme (NSS).
