





Total seating capacity of the library is increased from 180 to 210 users. The Library acquired 484 books during 2014-2015 and also subscribed 79 National Journals including popular magazines and 16 Foreign Journals. . The total collection of the Library has been augmented to 51365 books. It subscribed to access for the e-resources (6000+ e-journals and 97000+ e-books)through N-LIST 2.
